<u>Stay Organized</u> – Label and coordinate gear in color-coded stuff stuffs, e.g., red for clothes, green for food, blue for cooking gear, etc.

<u>Bear Bag (BB)</u> — Items marked (BB) need to be packed in a plastic bag and hung in the bear bag overnight. Place trash and any cooking gear that cannot be cleaned properly in the bear bag as well. At campgrounds, place all trash in bear-resistant dumpster or in the car (but remember: bears can break into cars). Do not keep any food or water inside the tent — ever.
